Most likely you leave those shoes in the basement or outside the back door. No, I am not clairvoyant. I, too, have a pair of shoes that I leave on the stoop at the side door under the carport. Some of you have seen those shoes when you came by to visit. The other day Jan looked out and saw a small bird sitting in one of my shoes. Evidently, it has decided to make my shoe its summer home. When Jan told me what was taking place I checked and sure enough there were some pine needles and other small twigs lying in my shoe. I do not have the heart to evict my new tenant, so I guess I am a landlord for the time being.

Isn't it interesting how God has placed an innate desire in His creation to do whatever needs to be done to take care of themselves and their loved ones? This goes for us humans as well. The Gospel of Mark records an incident when some men brought a friend to see Jesus. There was such a crowd that they could not get to where Jesus was actually speaking. So they improvised. They carried their friend on a stretcher to the roof, cut a hole in the roof, and lowered their friend down right in front of Jesus. Because of their effort, the friend was healed and walked out of the home carrying his stretcher (Mark 2:1-12).

The old adage, "Where there is a will, there is a way" comes to mind. We are all intelligent people. God has placed in us the ability to do what He has called and expects us to do. If you have friends or family that do not know Christ, you have the responsibility to share Christ with them. And it does not always have to come through a verbal witness alone. Invite them to dinner and a Gospel concert. Ask them to attend a conference with you that is conducted by Christians to encourage faith in Christ. Take them to a movie that is based on Christian truth or encourages Christian values. Invite them to a cookout at your home. Write a letter telling them how much you love them and want them to know Jesus. Be creative, but figure out a way to get the Gospel to them. If you will then they too can walk out of this life a changed person.
