Prophets Galore

The other day I was working out at the gym when a gentleman came up to me. He knew I was a pastor from talking with Randy Goad, who works out with me. He asked where I pastored and I told him FBCC. He went on to tell me how he had been saved in 2003. He is a member of a local Baptist church where he serves as a van driver and volunteer for the youth ministry. He was excited and appreciative for his salvation and the transformation his life had undergone. That just goes to show you that you never know where you are going to run into another believer.

It reminded me of the O.T. account in First Kings 18 where Elijah defeated the 850 prophets of Baal and Asherah. Queen Jezebel became so angry that she promised to kill Elijah just like God had killed her prophets. Feeling alone and afraid, Elijah runs away. He ends up in a cave on Mt. Horeb where he is hiding and sulking. When God approaches him and asks why he is hiding, Elijah's response was that he was the only one out there fighting for God and righteousness (1 Kgs. 19:14). God tells Elijah that He has 7,000 prophets serving as well. I am not sure God meant there were exactly 7,000 prophets. Rather, I think God wanted Elijah to know that there were so many other servants of God doing His work in addition to Elijah. That seemed to suffice for Elijah and he went about his ministry.

Maybe sometimes you think to yourself, "Nobody seems to care about ministry but me." Or "What I am doing is not making a difference." Or "I don't think anyone realizes what I sacrifice to serve the Lord." But the truth is, the people you minister to care. And what you are doing is not only making a difference in those you serve, but also in your church, as well as in your own life. And finally, the only one who really matters knows what you are doing and why you are doing it, and one day the Lord Christ Himself is going to recognize you and reward you for your service to Him. So don't lose heart and don't get weary or worried; everything is moving along just as God planned. Blessings in Christ.

- 2) Another way you can participate is to **donate items for Hygiene Bags** which will be given to the homeless. Items needed are travel sized bars of soap, razors, shaving cream, deodorant, mouth wash, Q tips, Wet wipes, and washcloths. Items are needed by **August 23.** There is a collection box outside the sanctuary. Our goal is to put together 100 bags.
