Teaching and Training Kids That Rock for Jesus

Hey boys and girls. When I was a child, one of the games kids played was marbles. Some of you may have never heard of marbles. So let me explain how you play. First, you draw a big circle in the dirt. Then each player puts the same number of his own marbles into the ring. The players take turns trying to knock each other's marbles out of the ring by shooting one of their marbles at one of their opponent's marbles (kind of like pool). When a shooter knocks a marble out of the ring, he picks it up and puts it in his pocket. If his shooting marble stays inside the circle, he is allowed to keep shooting. If not, the next player takes his turn. When all the marbles have been knocked out of the ring, they are counted and the one with the most marbles is the winner.

Before a game of marbles begins, one player will ask the other players, "Are we playing for fun, or are we playing for keeps?" If you just play for fun, when the game is over, the winner gives the marbles back. But if you play for keeps, the winner gets to keep his marbles, plus all of the marbles he has won.

Some people live their life as if it were a game of marbles. They spend all their time trying to get as much stuff as they can (cars, boats, clothes, 4-wheelers, vacation homes, money, etc.). They think that the one with the biggest house, the fanciest car, and the most money in the bank is the winner. They think they are playing "for keeps," but when they come to the end of their life, do you know how much of the stuff they get to keep? None! They spend their whole life trying to win all of the marbles, but in the end, they leave behind everything they have gotten!

Jesus said that if we want to be real winners we must be willing to give up everything and follow him (Read, Mark 8:34-38). When we follow Jesus, we may not have a lot of the things that some people think are important. However, we will have something that is much better. We will have everlasting life with Jesus. You see, when we give our lives to Jesus, HE "plays for keeps." There is nothing wrong with getting and enjoying things in this life. Just be sure you are making plans to live in heaven with Christ one day. And always remember, Jesus loves you and so do I.


