Welcome to a new year. We have officially began 2021. As with any new year, I have two things that I need. A new calendar for the upcoming year and a new notebook to write appointments and other information. The first day of the New Year will probably be the only day this notebook is clean. It has absolutely no writing in it anywhere. A clean notebook helps me remember the significance we place on a new year as a fresh start, a new year to live a life dedicated to God. In Ephesians 4:23 the bible tells us "Our hearts and minds must be made completely new." I know a lot of us are looking forward to a new year after 2020. We will need three things to help us do this. I am going to give you three things that begin with the letter C. Before you checkout the three things, look up the words **commitment**, **concentrate**, **and constant**. Finally, we will need to be constant in our commitment. That means we need to keep it up, to work at it all the time – not start and stop when we please.

We all here people who make New Year's resolutions at the beginning of each year. But, those resolutions only work if you stay with it.

This is something all ages can do. Find yourself a new clean notebook. Transfer the meaning of the three "C" words to your notebook. Write down how you can make this a wonderful new year for you. It may be something like your schoolwork and grades, some sport you want to excel at, helping someone, being kinder, or even a more devoted life to Jesus through prayer, reading your bible, or helping others.

Whatever you choose remember to:

- Commit to it
- Concentrate on what will be your contribution
- Be constant in your commitment keep it up.
