TEACH THE CHILDREN

Hi folks. I thought this illustration would remind us of the true meaning of Christmas. A couple of weeks before Christmas I had an unex-

He reached in again and pulled out a string of HOLLY and laid it on the mantle. "Teach the children that the holly plant symbolizes immortality.
