Teaching and Training Kids That Rock for Jesus

When we read the Bible, or memorize a verse, the Holy Spirit can speak to us as we think about what the Bible says. If we will do what the Bible asks us to do we will be ready for anything that might happen in life. I hope you all have invited Jesus into your lives. If not talk to mom, dad, grandmother, grandfather, your Sunday school teacher, or me. Any of us would be happy to help you know Jesus. Once you belong to Jesus, He will always be there to help you. Remember, Jesus loves you and so do I.
