There are so many kinds of pills out there that we could not name them all, even if we tried.

I expect some of you have to take a pill each day to help you feel good or be able to do things that need to be done. Wouldn't it be wonderful if someone could develop a pill that would cure everything! No matter what was wrong with you, this one pill would fix it. Well, thanks to God, there is such a pill. It is called the "Gos-pill." It is the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In the Book of Matthew Jesus told the disciples of John the Baptist (who was in prison for preaching) to tell him, *"the blind see, the lame walk, those with leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised to life, and the Good News is being preached to the poor"* (*Mt. 11:5*).
