Teaching and Training Kids That Rock for Jesus

Christ the King (John 18:37)

In one scene from the movie "Lion King" Simba sings, "I Just Can't Wait to Be King." If you have seen the movie, you will remember that one reason Simba was so anxious to become king was that he didn't want anyone telling him what to do. He didn't want to hear anyone saying, "do this" or "stop that." He wanted to be free to run around all day long doing anything he wanted to do. However, it wasn't just that Simba didn't want anyone to tell him what to do, he was also looking forward to telling everyone else what to do. Just listen to what he sings!

"I'm gonna be a mighty king so enemies beware! I'm gonna be the main event like no king was before. I'm brushing up on looking down. I'm working on my ROAR! Oh, I just can't wait to be king!"

I think Simba had a very poor idea of what it means to be a king. You see, the real role of a king is to look after the needs of his people. The king is responsible to provide for and protect those people who live in his kingdom. A good king is more concerned with caring for his people than he is in being served by them.

During his last days on earth, Jesus was arrested and put on trial. When asked if he was a king, Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world." Yes, Jesus was a king, but he wasn't interested in running around free and doing things His way. He was only interested in doing the will of his Father. He was born to be king, but his kingdom is not on this earth -- it is in heaven. He came to earth to make the way for us to live with him forever.

People who live in a specific kingdom are called the king's "subjects." They do not get to choose if he is their king—he is king by right of his power and authority over them. However, in the kingdom of heaven, we get to choose whether or not Jesus is our king. When we believe Jesus is the Son of God and ask Him to forgive our sin, He will save us. As his subjects, we should follow Jesus wherever He leads. That way we can forever be with Him in heaven.

Jesus can't wait to be your king. He has invited you to enjoy eternal life in his heavenly kingdom. If you haven't already accepted his invitation, I hope you will crown him as your King today.
