Teaching and Training Kids That Rock for Jesus

God Answers Prayer (Luke 11:5-10)

Hi boys and girls. I hope you are happy and healthy. When I was growing up "knock, knock" jokes were very popular. Here are a few to give you an example of what I am talking about.

Knock, knock. (Who's there?) Tank. (Tank who?) You're welcome!

Knock, knock. (Who's there?) Canoe. (Canoe who?) Canoe come out and play?

Knock, knock. (Who's there?) Boo. (Boo who?) Why are you crying?

Knock, knock. (Who's there?) Orange. (Orange who?) Orange you glad this is my last knock, knock joke?

That's enough knock, knock jokes. Now I have a riddle for you. How is a knock, knock joke like a prayer? If you do not go "knock, knock" nothing happens. Let me explain what I mean with a story from the Bible. One day Jesus was teaching His disciples about prayer. To help, He told them this story.

A man went to a friend's house late at night and said, 'I need to borrow some bread. I have a friend who is visiting my home and I do not have anything to feed him.' The man answered, 'It's late and all my family is in bed. I am not going to get up and give you some bread.' Even though the man did not want to get up just to give his friend bread, he did because his friend kept knocking on the door and asking for help.

After Jesus finished telling the story, He said to His disciples, "Ask, and what you ask for will be given to you. Look, and what you are looking for you will find. Knock, and the door you are knocking on will be opened. For everyone who asks will receive what they ask for. Everyone who looks will find what they are looking for. Everyone who knocks will have the door opened to them" (Luke 11:9-10).

Jesus was trying to make His disciples understand that God (our Heavenly Father) will answer our prayers if we do not stop praying. I hope you are joining me and your parents as we pray for the next 60 days for our church. Knock, knock. Who's there? God is there, and he answers our prayer! Thanks for spending some time with me today. Remember, Jesus loves you and so do I.

A NOTE FROM Mrs. Charlotte:

Happy February. When we think of February, we usually think of valentines, candy, flowers and of course LOVE.

Jesus often taught people that it was important to love others. In fact, his law said to "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27b) One time, someone asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus began to tell this story. It comes from Luke 10:30-37.

A certain man went down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell among thieves, who stripped him of his clothing, wounded him, and departed, leaving him half-dead. A certain priest came down the road. When he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. Another man, a Levite, came down the same road, looked at the man and passed by on the other side. But a third man, a Samaritan came down the road where the man was. The Samaritan had compassion for the man. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; and he set him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

The next day, when the Samaritan departed, he took out two coins, gave them to the innkeeper, and said to him, "Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, when I come again, I will repay you."

Jesus then said, "which of these three do you think was neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?" Jesus led the man to a painful admission – the Samaritan was obeying God's law by being a neighbor, while religious Jews were not. The Samaritan showed kindness to a man who probably hated him. The Bible says we should love our enemies. Sometimes that is hard to do, but if you truly love God by asking Jesus to be your Savior, you will show His love to others.

Think of some ways this month that you can show love. It may require some sacrifice – money, time, sharing, giving, and so on. Just as Jesus told the man who asked, "who is my neighbor?" if he truly loved God, he would show God's love to others. If you and I truly love God, we should be showing God's love too!
