When I was a boy I watched the "Superman" TV show. Each week the show would open with the same description of Superman. He was "able to leap tall buildings in a single bound, more powerful than a locomotive, and faster than a speeding bullet. Every young boy (and perhaps a few girls) dreamed about being Superman with his superpowers. Humans have always needed a hero/ heroine. We need someone to look up to; someone to model ourselves after; someone we can trust to always represent what is good and right. Now you might think you know where I am headed. but hang in here with me for a moment. Christians are expected to pattern themselves after Christ. This is a no-brainer in that the word "Christian" infers followers are "little Christs." There can be no greater role model than Jesus. While we will never be sinless, as was Jesus, we can sin less. However, in trying to mimic our role model, let us not forget that we too are role models. Christians are not afforded the luxury of blaming our shortcomings on the fact that we are "only human." Paul wanted Timothy to know that if he followed him, he would be following Jesus. Paul would never have done anything to hurt Timothy's faith walk. You and I are living expressions of Christ. When people see us they should see Jesus. Remember, people are watching you. Will you be their hero/ heroine?


