

- Four Calling/Collie Birds Four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John
- Five Golden Rings First five books of the Old Testament
- Six Geese-a-Laying Six days of creation before God's rest on the seventh day
- Seven Swans-a-Swimming Seven gifts of the Holy Spirit
- Eight Maids-a-Milking Eight Beatitudes
- Nine Ladies Dancing Nine fruits of the Holy Spirit
- Ten Lords-a-Leaping Ten Commandments
- Eleven Pipers Piping Eleven faithful disciples
- Twelve Drummers Drumming -Twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed

Interesting isn't it. This theory seems tailor-made for this time in our world when conspiracy theories are rampant and the internet reigns supreme as the quickest way to find information.


