
I participated in a Zoom meeting with the leaders of the WMU of Virginia on Saturday morning, Feb. 21st. The topic was Depression and Suicide. It had some great information that I am hoping we as a WMU group can help to organize in our church. They recorded the zoom meeting and I also hope to share that with you. Did you know that there are 45,000 suicides a year in the U.S., every 13 minutes someone in the U.S. takes his or her own life and 22 vets on average kill themselves every day? This was alarming to me. Then we have all those in our churches and communities who are struggling with Covid-19 isolation: such as older members of our community, shut-ins and those in health care facilities, school age children who are learning at their kitchen tables and are falling further and further behind, the High School Seniors of 2021 who have missed so much of their Junior and Senior year and the front-line workers who are no longer recognized for their service and not to mention those incarcerated who can no longer see friends and relatives. Yes, there are a lot of us struggling but we must remember to keep the faith and to keep reaching out to those in need. So be ready for some thinking out of the box ideas soon to come. We hope you will be able to participate in some upcoming projects.


