Salty Speech

wher "Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one." (Col. 4:6)

I don't know about you, but I think almost every food taste better with a little salt. Perhaps that is because I was raised in a family that cooked with salt and had salt on the table for those who desired more on their food. Today, we think of salt most often as a food enhancer. But it is also used as a preservative for food.

This metaphor of salt as a preservative is often alluded to in Scripture. It is said that first century Rabbis referred to wisdom as "salt." In the account of Jewish History, Ezra wrote, "Should you not know that the LORD God of Israel gave the dominion over Israel to David forever, to him and his sons, by a covenant of salt" (2 Chr. 13:5). Ezra was saying the promise God gave to David was a lasting agreement. He would always have a descendent ruling Israel.

Jesus may have been thinking along those same lines when He said that His followers were "the salt of the earth" (Mt. 5:13). Yes, our presence in this world can enhance the life of others. But we also are preserving a Christian witness, as well as, providing a true picture of God when we live in accordance with His precepts and principles.

Paul likely had the same idea when he wrote that a bornagain believer's speech should be gracious and "seasoned with salt". He added to his teaching about our speech when he told Ephesian believers to, "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers" (Eph. 4:29).

How do we talk around other people? Do we speak like the world, trying to fit in? Or do we speak graciously in ways that build up our hearers? Are our words attractive, conveying love and grace? How we speak to others is as important as what we say to them. Make sure your speech is salty.
