Content with the Content

Patter Be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." (Hebrews 13:5)

I have heard people say that the English language is difficult for a non-English speaking person to learn. The title of this article supports that belief. On one hand, "content" as an adjective means to be satisfied with something or someone. However, when using "content" as a noun it refers to the principal substance contained in a specific place (i.e. drawer or article).

I wonder how many of us can honestly say we are content with what we have. Whoever wrote the letter to the Hebrews challenged people to be content (satisfied) with the things they had. But if we look at the last half of our verse, the writer tells us that our contentment is not based so much on what we have, but who we have. The author is quoting from several passages in the Old Testament (Gen. 28:15, Deut. 31:8; Josh. 1:5; 1 Chr. 28:20) where God reminded people He would be with them in every situation. I like the way Eugene Petersen renders this verse in The Message. He says God told people, "I'll never let you down, never walk off and leave you."

When I read this verse, two truths come to mind that will assist us in becoming content in this life. One, if God is with me then I have divine resources available to me in every moment. God can accomplish things with me, thru me, and for me that I could not begin to imagine doing without Him. Two, I am one of God's adopted children, and so are you if you are saved. That means that God is watching over me. If God had a refrigerator, my picture would be on it. In any given moment, I have all that I need to enjoy life. If there is something I need God will enable me to meet that need, or He will supernaturally provide for me in the instance I cannot provide for myself. Therefore, I am blessed whether or not I have what I want or think I need. This is why Paul told Timothy, "Godliness with contentment is great gain" (1 Tim. 6:6). We are quickly approaching the Thanksgiving holiday. Let us prepare for our celebration by learning to be content with God and the blessings He has given us. Have a wonderful Thanksgiving!


Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes
