Power Hi folks. Can you believe it is already February?

Power Now I know that some of you may not be all that big on celebrating Valentine's Day. But can I tell you something—it is important to God. Well, the emphasis of our holiday, "love", is important to Him for several reasons.


For one, God is love (1 Jn. 4:8). Love is part of God's divine nature. Even unsaved, unchurched people will refer to love in their meanderings about God. If they do not know anything else about God, they know He is associated with love. Even when God is disciplining us or dealing out divine judgment, it is done so from a basis of His divine love for us.

Second, God responds to His creation in love. He does more than reflect love—He shows us His love. Think of how God's love is expressed to us. The greatest act of love was demonstrated by God sending Jesus to take our punishment for sin, so they we could be saved. Beyond that, God continues to persevere in that love by providing grace and mercy to us. He could simply walk away from us when we disobey Him or reject His promptings, but He does not. He keeps loving us. All those who end up in hell one day must trample the love of God underfoot to get there.

Finally, God expects His people to love. We often quote the last part of 1 John 4:8 that says "God is love." But the first half of that verse is just as important to the concept of God's love. It says, "He who does not love does not know God". That is pretty clear, is it not? If we say that we are born-again, then love must be a part of our lives. It is not enough to say we love God—we must show our love for Him. This being true, it is not enough to say we love others on behalf of God. We must show that we love them as God loves them. And that expression of love must resemble the love of God. If not, our words mean absolutely nothing. As Paul wrote, it becomes nothing more than a "noisy gong or a clanging cymbal" (1 Cor. 13:1).

So, this Valentine's Day, remember to let God know that you love Him. And express your love to others in ways that leave the message ringing loud and clear in their ears—"GOD IS LOVE". Blessings in Christ.


Greetings from the Lighthouse
