### **Harvest Time**

However, long before the words fall or autumn were used, people in England referred to that period of the year as "harvest". It comes from the Old Norse word [haust] which means to gather or pluck. An appropriate application since it was the time of year when farmers would gather their crops and prepare them for winter storage.

I like the word harvest. Mostly because it is a word that is important to the Lord Jesus Christ. One time Jesus and His disciples were on a preaching, healing tour when Jesus said to them, "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. 38 So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask him to send more workers into his fields" (Matt. 9:37-38). In God's economy of thinking, the spiritual harvest never goes out of season. He is always working to bring people into His family and we should be as well.

Jesus encouraged the Apostles to pray that more believers would commit to taking part in the harvest. However, we are not to pray to the exclusion of taking part in the harvest ourselves. There is a great feeling of accomplishment when God uses you to lead a lost person to Jesus. In that moment you have plucked someone from hell and place them in the safety of God's heaven.
